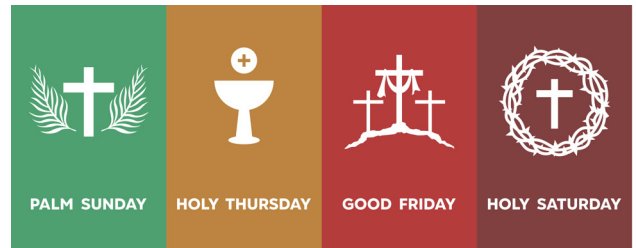

It flows between silence and meditative chant drawing us closer to the mystery of the cross. Veneration of the Cross ends this service. All are welcome to experience this meditative, contemplative service.



LENT

Lenten Discipleship Challenge**Week Four: March 15-21**

This week the church throughout the world keeps the second scrutiny as Lent focuses on blindness/sight. We all have tragic blind spots. What humans need more of is truth-laden “light.” True spirituality is about seeing. Sin is about blindness, or as Saint Gregory Nyssa writes, “Sin is the refusal to grow.” Prophets are those with clearer vision, they see the big patterns, they see what is always and forever true. Jesus forewarns (John 4:44), “a prophet gets no respect from his own.” Midweek, he himself, with 20/20 vision, turns his sight towards Jerusalem and, with eyes wide open, he knows what awaits him there. Rejection is what awaits a prophet sent to the Holy City. So let us set out in week four with clear eyes, willing to acknowledge our own blind spots, and entering Jerusalem, to see as the LORD sees.

Fourth Sunday of Lent, March 15

1 Samuel 16: 1b, 6-7 10-13a; Ephesians 5: 8-14; John 9: 1-41

The focus on the Fourth Sunday of Lent is on light. A man born blind is healed by Jesus as he step-by-step comes to believe in Jesus as the Messiah. The religious leaders, on the other hand, who had physical sight, could not “see” Jesus in that light. It is in this context that the author of Ephesians invites us to, “Live as children of light...for light produces every kind of goodness and righteousness and truth” (Ephesians 5:8-9). Today, produce one act of goodness, righteousness, or truth that comes from your faith in Jesus as Messiah. Do one good deed for someone, or be fair/righteous towards someone.

Monday, March 16

Isaiah 65: 17-21; John 4: 43-54

“Unless you people see signs and wonders, you will not believe” (John 4:48), Jesus admonished the people of Cana. Am I guilty of this as well? How many times do I demand proof that God has heard my prayer? Do I need to be more like the royal official in today’s Gospel and accept God at his word? Trust can make all the difference. I don’t always see how God provides, but that doesn’t mean our petition is denied. God ultimately provides what I need. God doesn’t always act according to our timing, but when the Almighty does act the LORD is right on time!

Tuesday, March 17: St. Patrick

Ezekiel 47: 1-9, 12; John 5: 1-16

On this St. Patrick’s Day, in Ezekiel’s vision water gushes from the temple and brings life, turning barren places into sources of abundance. In our Gospel, Jesus encounters a paralyzed man, waiting beside healing waters yet unable to reach them on his own. Together, we remind ourselves that God’s healing is not limited by our weakness, waiting, or disappointments. Christ steps directly into the man’s suffering and asks a direct question: “Do you want to be well” (John 5:6)? The life-giving waters of grace flow toward us, often in unexpected ways, inviting us to rise and walk in newness. Today, reflect on one place in your life that feels “stuck” and bring it to prayer, asking Jesus for the courage to take one small step toward healing or change.

Wednesday, March 18

Isaiah 49: 8-15, John 5: 17-30

“Can a mother forget her infant, be without tenderness for the child of her womb? Even should she forget, I will never forget you” (Isaiah 49:15). If God promises to never forget us, why does it feel at times as though he has? Perhaps unanswered prayers result in a tendency to give up. “Thus says the LORD: In a time of favor I answer you; on the day of salvation I help you” (Isaiah 49:8). “Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever hears my word and believes in the one who sent me has eternal life and will not come to condemnation, but has passed from death to life” (John 5:24). Introduce a Lenten affirmation into your prayer life, perhaps: “In echoes of silence I have faith in your promise LORD, that you never forget me”.

LENT**Thursday, March 19, Solemnity of Saint Joseph**

2 Samuel 7: 4-5a, 12a-14a, 16; Romans 4: 13, 16-18, 22; Matthew 1: 16, 18-21

We proclaim that “Jesus is the light of the world!”, and we long for his light to bring healing and new life to our world. As disciples, we are to continue to bring Christ’s light into our daily lives. Today is the Solemnity of St. Joseph. Through his righteousness and his trust in God’s voice speaking to him through his dreams (Matthew 1:20-22), St. Joseph literally was instrumental in helping bring Jesus and his light into the world. Today, pray to St. Joseph asking for his intercession that we too can bring Christ our Light into the world by imitating Jesus in our thoughts, words, and deeds.

Friday, March 20

Wisdom 2: 1a, 12-22; John 7: 1-2, 10, 25-30

Wisdom explores how persecuting those who seek to do justice makes people blind to God’s purpose. In John, Jesus secretly goes to Jerusalem for the Feast of the Tabernacles because people are trying to kill him. While teaching there, the authorities are unable to see him as the Messiah and try to arrest him. However, they are unable to because “his hour had not yet come” (John 7:30). What are we missing when we confuse God’s purpose or misunderstand God’s timing in our lives? As you go about your day, be intentional. Take note of what you have missed that has been there all along.

Saturday, March 21

Jeremiah 11: 18-20; John 7: 40-53

Christ does not arrive in the way we expect. In today’s Gospel, the people have specific expectations of what their Savior should look like, where he should come from, and what his lineage should represent (John 7:41-42). Jesus is the unexpected one—the king wrapped in humble clothes. It can be difficult and frustrating when God does not fit into our own narratives or neatly into our boxes. Yet this is the beauty of a living God: we are called to grow into the expansive space of love, not confine it with narrow definitions or exclusion. Reflect on a time where you let your expectations define your present, work towards letting them go for God to enter.

On March 19, we will celebrate the Solemnity of St. Joseph, Husband of Mary who dedicated his life to the care of the Blessed Virgin and Jesus. To honor St. Joseph, there is a classic Catholic tradition we know as St. Joseph’s Table where food is set aside for the poor. You are invited to bring non-perishable food items to the church from March 5–19 and place them by the statue of St. Joseph in the Holy Family Chapel or, during weekdays, to the church office. All donations will be blessed during the evening prayer scheduled in his honor on March 19 and will benefit the St. Vincent De Paul Food Pantry and the “Feed the Spirit” ministry to assist our school children in need.
